The Leadership and Wisdom Enforcement Award is a monthly, merit-based award that recognizes Leaders amongst youth who attend LISD and UISD School Districts enrolled in the Criminal Justice Programs who demonstrate Good Judgment, Justice, initiative-driven leadership impacting their academic, work, or community environments. It is an Award that has Active Youth Leaders in the CBP EXPLORER Post 2304 Program Recognizing other youth Leaders involved in the Criminal Justice Programs in Schools who have an interest in having a career in Law Enforcement. It will recognize and reward youth who portray the 14 Leadership traits:

Youth Leadership And Wisdom Enforcement Award

What are the LAW Enforcement Awards?

CBP Explorer Post 2304 has created a program to identify young leaders actively enrolled in Criminal Justice Programs and recognize them for:

- Standing up for what is right/Finding a way to address a wrong.
- Making a difference in a significant way at his or her school or community.
- Tutors/mentors others
- 90 Grade Point Average or above
- Stands out above their Peers
- Volunteers with Community Projects/Charity Work/Criminal Justice Programs/
- JJ-DID-TIE-BUCKLE

In a partnership with CBP Explorer Post 2304, Falcon International Bank, and KGNS together (working on additional in kind sponsors) will identify one current high school student from each of the school districts who exhibit strong leadership skills, academic excellence, and exceptional character on a monthly basis. This character can be shown through participation in extracurricular activities, volunteering, and/or demonstrating a positive influence on their peers.

The selected students will receive a recognition award plaque, certificates from various sponsors and the opportunity to participate in an end of the school year LAW Enforcement Youth of the Year AWARD.

Who is eligible to be nominated?

Any high school Senior or Junior who will be graduating in the Spring Semester of 2017, and who is enrolled in the Criminal Justice Program. Student must have a 90 GPA and not have any conduct issues at home, school or the community. The Principal of each high school along with the Criminal justice coordinators and teachers, can nominate one student whose application will be verified by The CBP Explorer Post Lead Advisor and Falcon International Bank award _ committee. The Student Nomination Form will be issued by CBP Explorer Post 2304. Nominated students need to be submitted by the 28th of each month.

How should a principal/administrator determine appropriate student to select?

Administrator/Educators should select a student who demonstrates the highest level of leadership. Examples of this could include involvement in extracurricular activities at school, commitment to volunteering in the community, and/or having an overall positive impact on their peers.

When are the winners chosen?

The recipients will be selected and announced monthly. At the end of the school year, the recipients will be eligible for the CBP Explorer Post 2304 and Falcon International Bank Leadership and Wisdom Enforcement Award Youth of the year.

LAW Enforcement Award Requirements

- A) Nominees must be a high school senior or junior graduating in the spring semester of 2017.
- B) Nominees should state their leadership roles in improving their community and/or living conditions by addressing the fourteen leadership traits (JJ-DID-TIE-BUCKLE).
- C) Nominees must be in the Criminal Justice Program and participate in a school activities (band, athletics, cheerleading, student council, and clubs) and/or community service (boys/girls club, coaching, fundraisers, etc.). ** A nominee unable to fulfill this requirement due to work obligations is still eligible to receive this award.
- D) Nominees must maintain at least a 90 grade point average or better and must not have any conduct problems in school and/or the community.
- E) Nominees are nominated for this award by an educator and selected by a committee composed by counselors/administrators at their respective schools.
- F) All applications must be typed using Times New Roman font Size 12.
- G) Selected LAW Award students must submit a self-portrait (at least wallet size) in formal attire; such as a graduation photo. **absolutely no “selfie” photos.
- H) Nominees must be of legal status in the United States.

Selection Procedure

- A) Each Month beginning in September, Criminal Justice Department will nominate student utilizing the Leadership And Wisdom (LAW) packet.
- B) Teachers will submit all nominee packets to the school counselor for review. LAW Award Recipient will be selected by a panel of CBP Explorer Advisors
- C) All selection packets are due on the 28 of each month. The Explorer Post 2304 Lead Advisor will contact each school and pick up the selection packets.
- D) Both UISD and LISD Criminal Justice Programs will be considered. Each month 1 nominee meeting the required criteria will be submitted by their respective schools. Each month 1 nominee from each School District will be selected as the LAW Enforcement Award recipients.
- E) At the end of the school year (May), CBP Explorer Post 2304 will gather a selection committee to select the Leadership And Wisdom Enforcement Youth of the Year.
