**Performance Objective 1:** Establish a safe, drug free environment that is conducive to learning, consequently reducing disciplinary and drug referrals by 5% per year, truancy by 2%, and will maintain a dropout rate no higher than 1.5% overall, and will reduce students placed at an AEP by 2% as reported by PEIMS.

**Evaluation Data Source(s) 1:** PEIMS report will show 5% decrease in drug and disciplinary 2% referrals, 2% decrease in truancy cases, 2% decrease in the number of students placed at an AEP, and maintain a dropout rate no higher than 1.5%.
